Overview

HO CHI MINH MAUSOLEUM

The President Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum is a mausoleum which serves as the resting place of Vietnamese revolutionary leader and President Ho Chi Minh in Hanoi, Vietnam.



ONE PILLAR PAGODA

The One Pillar Pagoda, formally belongs to an architecture complex called Diên Hựu tự which means Extend Bless pagoda. The pagoda is a historic Buddhist temple in the central Ba Đình district, Hanoi, the capital of Vietnam.



TEMPLE OF LITERATURE

Văn Miếu is a temple dedicated to Confucius in Hanoi, northern Vietnam. The temple also hosts the Imperial Academy, Vietnam's first national university. The temple was built in 1070 at the time of Emperor Lý Thánh Tông. It is one of several temples in Vietnam which is dedicated to Confucius, sages and scholars.



NINH BINH PROVINCE

Ninh Bình is a province in northern Vietnam's Red River Delta. In the province's northwest, the vast Cúc Phương National Park is known for its green valleys, karst mountains and conservation centers.



TRAN QUOC PAGODA

Tran Quoc Pagoda, the oldest Buddhist temple in Hanoi, is located on a small island near the southeastern shore of Hanoi's West Lake, Vietnam.



DONG XUAN MARKET

Dong Xuan Market is the largest indoor market in Hanoi.

What one can find there is truly astounding, whatever you're looking for whether it'd be some fresh local produce, souvenirs or in need of a laptop - chances are some vendor tucked away has it.

Established in the late 19th century, the Dong Xuan Market can be found in a four story communist styled building on the edge of the Old Quarters.



ST JOSEPHS CATHEDRAL

St. Joseph's Cathedral is a Catholic church on Nhà Chung Street, in the Hoàn Kiếm District of Hanoi, Vietnam. It is a late 19th-century Gothic Revival church that serves as the cathedral of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Hanoi. The cathedral is named after Joseph, the patron saint of Vietnam.



HOA LO PRISON MUSEUM

The Hoa Lo Prison Museum or known by its ironically nickname, the "Hanoi Hilton" will make you experience a range of emotions from disgust, sorrow to outrage at how something like this was allowed to happen. The museum displays and educates on the sufferings of the Vietnamese revolutionaries who were confined under the occupying

TRADITIONAL AO DAI COSTUME


Ao dai, widely regarded as Vietnam's national costume for women, consists of a long tight-fitted dress that's worn over slacks in contrasting colours. Hoi An is renowned its professional tailoring services, where you can choose from an extensive collection of fabric and have your very own custom-made aoi dai for about VND 700,000 to VND 1,500,000.



SILK

Silk in Vietnam is made from the cocoons of silkworms using manual looms, and comes in a variety of patterns and colors. You can find plenty of fashion boutiques and souvenir shops selling shirts, ties, accessories, and dresses at relatively affordable prices. A regular Vietnamese silk typically costs VND 70,000 per metre while premium fabrics are priced over VND 100,000 per metre.

VIETNAMESE COFFEE

Vietnamese coffee beans can be found just about anywhere in Vietnam, from local markets and quaint cafes to shopping malls and international airports. Hanoi is arguably the epicentre of Vietnam's café culture, where you can get a 1kg bag of whole or ground Robusta beans for about USD4. With numerous branches in Hanoi, Hoi An, and Ho Chi Minh City, Trung Nguyen is one of the most popular local coffee brands in Vietnam.



PEARL JEWELLERY

Pearl farms are mainly found in coastal locations such as Ha Long Bay and Van Phong Bay, with Saigon Pearls widely known as the best place in Vietnam for authentic pearls and jewellery. Located in Nha Trang, this home-grown brand has several showrooms selling necklaces, bracelets, pendants, earrings, and rings at VND 3,000,000 upwards. If you're not a fan of pearls, accessories made with gold and colourful gemstones are available as well.

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
